## Symptoms :

Hashwin was a very active and energetic boy by nature. He suddenly started developing rashes around his face, legs and hands and neck. His parents thought that it would be because of some infection since he played in the sand. But he got very sick with high fever that he was not even able to move around.

## Diagnosis :

They approached Vennela Hospital, Vijayawada. Dr. Ch. Mallikarjuna Rao, the pediatrician, was very empathetic that he certainly took all the tests needed and diagnosed him with all the knowledge he had. The symptoms were Rashes around the neck, cracked and red lips, swollen and rashes in hands and legs and body rashes.

He diagnosed him with a very rare medical condition - Kawasaki Disease. It affects the arteries that carry blood to the heart. It affects only children less than 5 years and does not affect children who are more than 8 years old.

Dr. Mallikharjuna Rao, was so excellent in the field of pediatrics that he had diagnosed the disease at early stage itself within 5 days of the symptoms appearing.

## Treatment :

He cared for him and nurtured him so well that his parents never felt scary about their child's condition. He treated him so well and kept a watch on his heart conditions also since this condition can bring heart problems also. He recovered totally and there was no damage to his heart or any other organs. He was back home and after a few more regular check - ups he is perfectly alright now and he's even more energetic, active and playful now. But as of in India, it was a very rare medical condition diagnosis in Medical history.
